Listening to children and youtl is the first step to help them grow healthy and safe

Listen First was launched in 2016 during the United Nations General Assembly Special Session (UNGASS) on the World Drug Problem. It began as a campaign on science-based drug prevention to raise awareness around listening to children and youth as the first step to help them grow healthy and safe.

Key Objectives

- Promote science-based drug prevention using fun, educational and inclusive materials
- Listen First complements national and other prevention efforts
- The initiative targets parents, teachers, policymakers, health and prevention workers.



Materials

Listen First the original material consisted of three videos + science sheets focusing on the importance of active listening, setting family rules, and parental involvement.

The Science of Care was a response to the COVID-19 pandemic, to support parents at this difficult time. It is composed of ten videos and Science Sheets on the Science of Affection, Family Activities, Active Listening, Play, Patience, Physical Activity, Praise, Information, Routine, and Keeping Busy.

Super Skills - The Science of Skills supports social and emotional skill development in primary aged children. Five fun, educational 3D animated videos where "Helpful Handy", "Sensitive Smellup", "Likeable Listenup" and "Loyal Lookup" face common life challenges and use social and emotional skills to solve problems, build relationships and improve their magical community. Ten Skills Sheets focused on competencies - Empathy, Compassion, Respect, Gratitude, Honesty, Integrity, Confidence, Hope, Motivation, Curiosity.









Since its beginnings, Listen First has grown into a global campaign. It is endorsed by key prevention experts, translated into over ten languages, and partners and Member States have implemented Listen First in their national strategies, reaching communities and young people worldwide.
